Zoë Reiter serves as the National Endowment for Democracy (NED) first combating kleptocracy director. In this role, Reiter leads the design and implementation to a "whole of NED" approach for supporting civil society around the world to detect, deter and dismantle kleptocratic systems. She brings more than fifteen years of experience to the role – working with pro-democracy organizations to build resilient and impactful strategies to fight kleptocracy and transnational corruption.

In 2019, she co-founded the Anti-Corruption Data Collective (ACDC), an international coalition that brings together leading journalists, data analysts, academics, and policy advocates to expose transnational corruption flows and push for policy change. From 2019 through 2023, she also served as director of strategic initiatives at the Project On Government Oversight (POGO), where she led work to strengthen US systems against money-laundering and malign foreign influence. Reiter was previously based in Berlin, where she worked for 12 years at the global secretariat of Transparency International (TI), the global anti-corruption movement, leading various multi-country programs and working closely with anti-corruption activists from Latin America to Eastern Europe to West Africa. For example, Reiter led the design and implementation of a program with nine Latin American and African chapters of TI, together with the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime to make criminal justice systems more resistant to capture by organized crime and corrupt interests. In her last two years at TI, she led the re-establishment of the US office of TI. Reiter also brings over a decade of experience working in philanthropy as a consultant to The Ford Foundation.

Reiter holds a bachelor's degree in Latin American studies from Rice University, joint master's degrees in Latin American studies and community and regional planning from the University of Texas at Austin, and a master's degree in cultural anthropology from Columbia University.

In the areas of anti-corruption, public procurement, and public servant responsibilities, he has provided training to numerous federal and state public sector agencies and entities since 1986, accumulating more than 400 courses, seminars, and presentations on the aforementioned laws and their complementary regulations.

He is the author of the books "The Regulation of the Federal Government Procurement Process"; "The Abolition of Pretrial Detention"; and "The Contracting of Goods, Leases, and Services in the Federal Public Administration." He is also the author of several articles published in specialized journals on Law and Public Administration, relating to the public procurement regime, the administrative responsibilities of public servants, and the National Anti-Corruption System.

He was a speaker at the International Institute of Government Ethics in Washington, D.C. representing Mexico and at the Latin American Congress for Administration and Development in Guatemala, the Dominican Republic, Brazil, and Uruguay, and a consultant for the World Bank.

Preservation of Digital Evidence in Audit Findings and Anti-Fraud Investigations

In today's digital age, preserving digital evidence is paramount due to the increasing reliance on technology for communication, transactions, and data storage. However, digital evidence is inherently fragile and can be easily altered, deleted, or corrupted if not properly preserved.

Ensuring the integrity and authenticity of digital evidence through meticulous preservation techniques is essential to maintain its admissibility in court and to uphold the credibility of the investigative process.

In this presentation, Doug White, Ph.D., CCE, CCNA, CISSP, PI (RI), reviews techniques for preserving various types of digital evidence and considerations for acquiring digital evidence in both traditional and cloud environments. The session covers the physical acquisition (imaging) of digital devices, acquisition of folders, acquisition of cloud-based materials, and the preservation of digital evidence in multiple formats.

Additionally, the session discusses virtual machines and other methods where evidence may be concealed and ways to acquire and preserve that type of evidence. Both NIST Special Publication 800-861 and NIST Special Publication 800-101r12 serve as foundational resources for auditors and antifraud professionals seeking to develop organizational policies.

By adhering to best practices in digital evidence preservation, auditors, CFEs and assurance professionals can safeguard the integrity of their engagements and investigations while contributing to the broader goal of maintaining trust and transparency in the digital landscape, attaining effective risk management and legal compliance, and ensuring that digital data remains reliable and credible.

Building Trust: Responsibility of Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) in Strengthening Integrity Systems in Mexico and Abroad

This fireside chat will explore the critical role of micro, small and medium enterprises (MSMEs) in strengthening integrity systems globally and in Mexico. The panel experts will discuss the evolution of private sector integrity initiatives, the challenges and opportunities for Mexican MSMEs to participate, and strategies for incorporating MSMEs into broader anti-corruption efforts. The discussion will highlight the economic importance of MSMEs, particularly in Mexico, and how their involvement in integrity initiatives can positively influence their growth and competitiveness.

MSME represents nearly 90% of businesses globally and 95% in Mexico and are vital to the country's economy. However, MSMEs often face barriers to engaging in integrity and anti corruption initiatives. The panel experts will examine the history of private sector integrity efforts globally and in Mexico, the role of MSMEs in participating in ethical private sector initiatives, and practical steps for engaging MSMEs. Panel experts will also share experiences which highlight the benefits ethics and integrity have for MSMEs. Finally, panelists will share examples of successful MSME integrity initiatives in collective action programs.

Corruption as an Enabling Factor of Transnational Organized Crime - United Nations Best Practices and Perspectives for its Prevention and Combat.

Through the United Nations Convention against Corruption (UNCAC), a comprehensive approach is promoted to prevent, punish, and eradicate corruption, strengthening institutional integrity and international cooperation. On its part, the United Nations Convention against Transnational Organized Crime (UNTOC) complements this framework by providing legal tools to confront criminal networks that operate globally. Both Conventions are interconnected, as corruption allows organized crime to infiltrate institutions, evade controls, and operate with impunity.

This presentation will address various strategies to combat corruption and economic crimes, based on the premise that the joint and coordinated implementation of the UNCAC and UNTOC can strengthen institutional capacities, close spaces of impunity, and promote a culture of legality, cooperation, and accountability.

Among these strategies are the promotion of transparency and access to information through independent institutions; the strengthening of oversight and anti-corruption bodies; adequate protection for whistleblowers; the use of advanced technology as means of prevention and detection; and the promotion of a culture of integrity from basic education to professional training.

In this way, the implementation of the Conventions and the strengthening of key institutional initiatives and capacities can generate positive effects in the short term, especially concerning institutions that play a crucial role in the fight against corruption in Mexico, such as the Secretariat of the Civil Service (SFP), the Superior Audit Office of the Federation (ASF), the Specialized Prosecutor's Office for Combating Corruption, and the National Anti-Corruption System (SNA), among others.

The above requires a technical vision for confronting corruption, including the implementation of legal reforms, the strengthening of internal controls, the promotion of citizen participation, and international cooperation, as well as the political will at the highest level to close the door to impunity.

5 key learning points for attendees:
